



STREET NAMING and SPECIFICATION for STREET NAMEPLATES

Public Health Act 1925, Sections 17-19
Town Improvement Clauses Act 1847, Sections 64 and 65

1. Nameplates shall be provided by the Developer and erected before any dwelling in the street is occupied. The nameplate shall be fixed to the satisfaction of the District Council, clear of visibility areas so as not to cause an obstruction.
2. General specification for nameplates is either 90mm or 100mm high black lettering, "KINDERSLEY" or "MOT" capitals on a white reflective background with minimum 10mm black edging. Should the plate require the inclusion of 'leading to etc.' the lettering to be 50mm high capitals. The plate can be either 150mm or 225mm deep, mounted on 50mm diameter galvanized, aluminum or plastic-coated steel posts at approximately 1000mm height above ground level. Where the road served is a cul-de-sac, a "No Through Road" symbol in accordance with diagram No.816.01 of the Traffic Signs Regulations, 1975 shall be incorporated after the street name.
